Looking For Global Mission Trip Opportunities?



Are you ready to step out and engage in mission? We are blessed to have many partner organizations who are sent as Christ's "hands and feet" throughout the world. If you feel a call to join them in short- or long-term mission, here are some opportunities that we encourage you to explore:

Shorter-term mission opportunities:

- **Colforpaz** (<u>www.colforpaz.org</u>) Working in Colombia, COLFORPAZ can organize custom trips for an individual or mission team to Bogota, Cartagena and elsewhere, partnering with a local church community in a variety of sustainable development projects.
- **Cristosal** (<u>www.cristosal.org</u>) works in El Salvador and offers a variety of courses through its Global School, as well as pilgrimages and custom trips. Its programs center around human rights, community development and local empowerment.
- **Dominican Development Group** (<u>dominicandevelopmentgroup.org</u>) is working in the Dominican Republic. DDG can help with facilitation, planning and deployment for mission teams of all sizes throughout the year, including construction and medical mission.
- **Elewana** (<u>www.elewana.org</u>) works in Kenya to promote education and local leadership. Elewana offers summer and teaching internships, volunteer opportunities and a residential

training program in service learning, sustainable community development and global partnerships.

- El Hogar (www.elhogar.org) operates four schools for abandoned and hopelessly poor students, and welcomes service teams of up to 15 from February through October.
- **Grey Dove** (<u>www.greydoveinc.org</u>). Grey Dove coordinates medical mission teams to Haiti for both medical and non-medical personnel, as well as conducting conferences on best medical mission practices.
- Haiti Connection (www.haitiepiscopalconnection.org) provides important conferences for connecting Episcopalians and other who are working in Haiti. Their next conference is expected to take place in the spring of 2016.

Longer-term mission opportunities:

- Young Adult Service Corps (YASC) is for 21-30 year-olds who are interesting in serving for a one-year placement. The application deadline for 2016 is expected to be around Jan 1st, 2016. Visit www.episcopalchurch.org/yasc for more information and to apply.
- **Episcopal Mission Personnel** (<u>www.episcopalchurch.org/page/mission-personnel</u>) is for adults of all ages who are interested in exploring a mission placement in all areas of the world, typically for three years. Applications are accepted on a rolling basis. Contact the Mission Personnel office for more information and for assistance with discernment.

Telling Our Stories: Returning From the Mission Field in Colombia

The Rev. Canon Dr. Ted Gaiser recently returned from three years of service in Colombia as parish priest and Director of Mission Development for the Episcopal Diocese of Colombia. Ted recently handed over the reins as former President of the Board of Directors for GEMN. We interviewed him about his experience as a missionary in Colombia.

What was the best part of your experience as a long-term missionary?

"There are many things about my experience in long-term mission that were rewarding and fulfilling ... a renewed and deepened relationship with Christ; experience of the wider church; experience of daily life in the church through a different cultural perspective; learning new things about myself; and more ... "

What part of the experience were you most prepared for? Least prepared for?

"I'm not sure that you're ever really prepared. I think preparation is often an illusion. We may bring a variety of experiences from previous mission engagements, interactions with different cultures, our employment, or our personal lives. Those experiences all assist us in





making decisions and processing our next experiences. But it doesn't really mean we're prepared."

"That's probably a funny thing to say coming from someone like me. I've been engaged in mission since my teens. I've lived abroad as an exchange student in South America, have led mission trips throughout Latin America and the Caribbean, in East Africa and to the West Bank. I've also traveled a great deal for pleasure. In addition, as an ordained person I served the Diocese of Massachusetts for seven years supporting Global Partnerships."

"Being prepared is more about being prepared to take a leap of faith and trust in God than any of the traditional things we might think of in society that prepare us to do a job. ...there is no school to become a missionary except for the school of life and the spiritual growth that comes from our life in Christ. It's good to have an experience of mission to know what you're getting into. It's also advisable to have a good sense of self-awareness. But being prepared to take the leap of faith is still the essential component."

What was the best advice that you received prior to going?

"I don't particularly remember getting any advice. I don't think people know what to say. Most people don't have any idea what life will be like for you, and many are confused. They might respect what they perceive as your courage, deep spirituality, or more, but still not fully "get" what you're

doing or why. So most advice is actually just words of support along the lines of "Good luck," "Take care of yourself," "God be with you," and "I hope you have a great experience."

Would you recommend this experience to others?

"I'd absolutely recommend the experience. It isn't for everyone, but for those who feel called to this type of ministry, it's definitely worth the experience."

Any advice to others considering a long-term mission experience?

"Pray. Pray some more. Talk with someone who has done it. Pray. Go on a (short-term) mission trip for the experience. And then pray. ...Oh, and also, pray!"


